I did of course say no to some things but my immediate response to requests could no longer just be no. This changed our relationship as I grew to listen to her in deeper more meaningful ways.

This year I want to suggest to not give up love. In this world we live in, where social media shows us the only things, we love are puppies and babies, and people we disagree with we cannot talk to let alone love. As a result, love is in short supply. You may even think you cannot love the world, or neighbors, the people different from us. The good news is you can learn how, you don't even have to know them.

There are four ways we as a church can show unconditional love today.

1. Welcome strangers like long lost siblings.

imagine how it would feel to be welcomed into a new space as though the people knew you and cared for you. "How are you? It's great to see you." Simple statements to change the attitude of welcome a stranger.

2. Pray for people you disagree with or are angry with.

I don't mean pray to change their heart. Rather pray for your heart to change toward them.

3. Love people as they are.

For an entire day, every time you think about wanting to fix or change someone, take notice, ask God to help you to reach out to them in love.

4. Invite people to church you wouldn't normally associate with.

Don't think about why you wouldn't associate with them, no economics, not socially, no judgements. Just invite them. This can take away conditions of our love for others and allows for the unconditional love from God.

It is hard to love people, let alone like them. Love is what is needed, unconditional love. This Lent let's make a real difference in the world by not giving up love, or our neighbor, or being the church. Instead let's start loving unconditionally instead of giving up start something new.


Easter Flowers
